Presidents Notes:

I completely agree that we need to work on getting better classes. I've certainly learned something of value from every class, though some things, I'm not sure I'll actually do as part of my business. One of the problems is that some specialties require a large investment in tools and equipment. From a business owner's perspective, there must be a reasonable expectation of a return on an investment. Even so, I am committed to attending classes and learning as much as I can.

During our July class, I was wondering if I'd ever have a reason to use a modified cylinder. In the past, I had doubts that I'd do much with Electronic Access Control. Currently, I'm putting what I learned in these and other classes together. I'm installing a new EAC system for a church and realized a need to bypass or override the EAC system with a key switch.

The switch is operated by a standard mortise cylinder, so it's key compatible with the building master key system. It's possible to have two independent switches. One is operated when the plug is rotated to the left and the other is operated when turned to the right. I modified the plug, so that a master key can operate either switch, but the change key will only rotate left. Certainly, other solutions are possible, but without the knowledge of how to modify a cylinder, I would have needed to use two key switches. My point is, we might not know what information will be of value to us in the future. We choose solutions to a given problem, based on what we know.

We do have a good class and a PRP Exam sitting scheduled for January, in Lincoln. I'll be working with Ryan Anderson to set up a class for April, in Omaha. Once again, we are starting a new year, so it is time to pay dues. for Lincoln, in JanThe value of the information presented in a class is not, necessarily related to the cost of the class. Some of the most useful classes I've attIt is equally difficult to predict attendance for a class. When we set up an ACE (ALOA Continuing Education) class, we need to have adequate attendance to support the class. While we could afford to lose money occasionally, we can't absorb losses on every class.
